Page 110: In 1935, Austrian racer Hannes Schroll told American reporters that he had won “more than 100 international ski titles in Europe,” but in his article on Schroll in the December 2009 issue of *Skiing Heritage Magazine*, ski historian Morten Lund wrote “There were hardly enough such races back then to let anyone win quite that many.” According to Schroll’s good friend Bill Klein, the boast was just “Hannes being Hannes.”
